A vibrant social program designed to bring people together in a safe, supportive, and inclusive environment. With a strong focus on social connection, independence, and emotional well-being, our energetic mentors ensure every experience is not only fun but empowering. Whether it's trying something new or simply enjoying a night out, KIN Friendship is where lasting memories and meaningful connections are made.

For Women and Gender Diverse People

Overview

A wonderful, meaningful initiative specifically for women, non-binary people and anyone who connects with a soft, creative space.

Facilitated in a safe, welcoming, creative space to encourage connection, self-expression, enjoyment and meaningful social interaction through art and crafts.

Activity Features

- Build friendships and social connections
- Facilitated by a qualified psychosocial mentor and mental health first aider.
- Selection of art and craft projects depending on individual interests.
- Trauma-informed, inclusive and culturally safe space.
- Creativity & self-expression encouraged.
- Tea, coffee & light snacks provided
- BYO lunch, fridge, microwave provided.
- **Projects** include but not limited to: Guided painting, collage & vision boards, beading & jewellery making, crystal pictures, crystal pot plants, clay sculpting, air-dry crafts, journaling & decorating notebooks.

Automotive Skills

Overview

A practical (5) session automotive skills-based training program that is designed to cover all the basics for people of any age. Learn about how cars work, putting fuel in the vehicle, how to carry out simple maintenance tasks to reduce trips to the mechanic, confidently discuss service and repair requirements, change a tyre and jump start a car when required.

- Changing oil/Water & check fluid levels
- Battery Maintenance
- Tyre Maintenance
- Engine checks & Logbooks
- Jump starts & fuel
- Cleaning & Polishing
- Capacity building independence

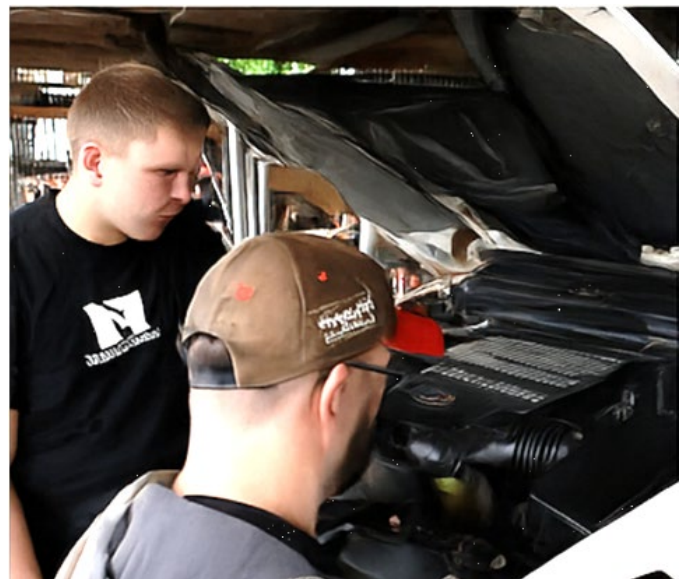

Personal Training

Overview

A Personal Training program that supports participants to achieve their health and fitness goals in a way that suits them best—whether at the gym, in the park, at home, or in our Y.E.S KIN space. Our PT Mentors create personalised, inclusive fitness plans tailored to everyone’s needs, abilities, and preferences—ensuring everyone, regardless of disability or confidence level, can feel empowered and supported on their fitness journey.

Activity Features

- Build friendships and social connections by exercising in a group environment.
- One to one exercise programs to build independence to pursue health and wellbeing goals.
- Walking, Circuits, Chair yoga and programs tailored to suit rehabilitation or strength goals.
- Exercise that’s fun not a chore.
- Can meet specific Rehabilitation and core strength goals.
- Lower sensory stimuli, not crowded, private gym facility.

Creative Industries

Shaping Wood, Building Lives

Overview

Industrial Creations offers inclusive, hands-on programs in woodworking, group creative classes, and life skills – designed to support people with disability and older adults. These sessions empower participants to build confidence, develop fine motor and cognitive skills, and foster meaningful social connections.

Activity Features

- **Build friendships** and social connections through teamwork reducing isolation and loneliness.
- **Cognitive Stimulation.** Planning and problem-solving during projects help keep the brain active and engaged.
- **Mental Health & Mindfulness.** Creative and constructive activities offer a calming space that can ease anxiety and build focus.
- **Supports NDIS & Aged Care Goals.** Encourages capacity building, social participation, daily living skills, and greater independence.
- **Supportive mentors** guide participants in developing skills at their own pace, while fostering a sense of purpose, routine, and belonging.

With a focus on fun, friendship, and personal growth, our KIN After School Program provides a safe and supportive setting where teens can relax, learn, and thrive.

Your teen will enjoy high-quality care in a safe, engaging environment—and create holiday memories to last a lifetime.
