

ELIGIBLE?

SLES is available to NDIS participants who are about to leave, or have recently left, school and would like some extra assistance making the transition to working life. While the supports are typically aimed at year 12 students, anyone who's legally old enough to leave school can access them. This is usually around year 10, but this varies depending on which state or territory you're living in. In most cases, the cut-off age for SLES eligibility is 22.

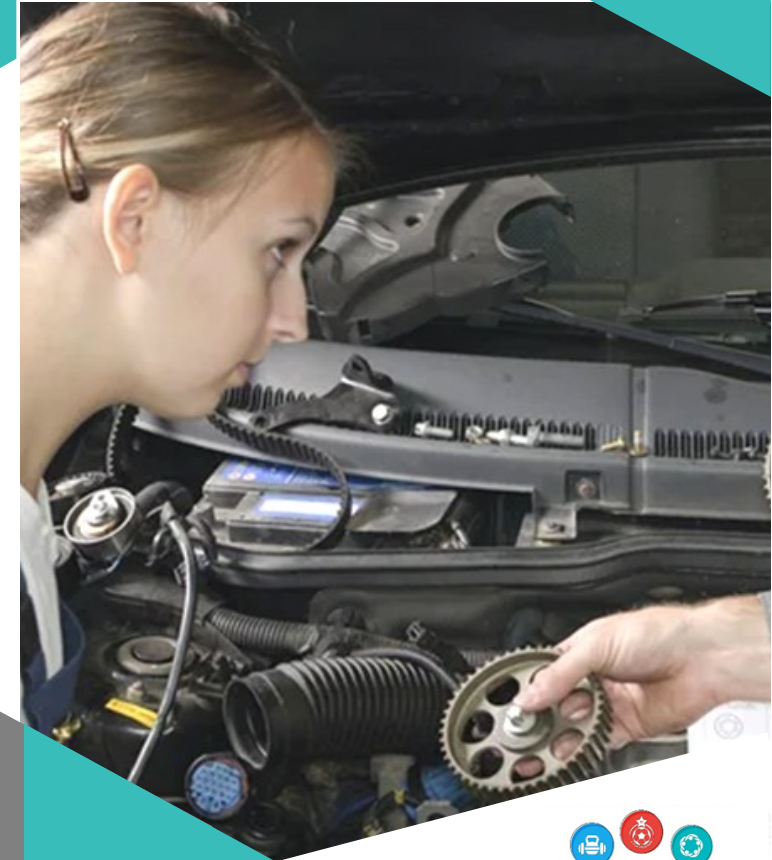

We offer flexible scheduling, including evenings and weekends, to ensure accessibility for all.

TRAVEL PROGRAM

Delivers and develops participants skills to confidently and independently access and use the public transport network. Community excursions to reinforce skills and provide hands-on experience.

MONEY, MONEY, MONEY

A modularized program that offers flexibility to be modified and extend, tailored to participants needs. The programs have been structured to encourage more involvement with engaging activities with excursions that reinforce everyday financial capabilities that will support lifelong learning.

JOB READY

This program focuses mainly on the non-technical skills needed to get a job. They include skills such as: teamwork, communication, building rapport, cooperation and collaboration, time management, planning and organising, A few essential workplace topics are covered; How to navigate the workplace, protocols and safety.

INTERVIEW SKILLS

Equips participants to effectively present themselves, aligning their experience with job requirements. Covers researching, preparing questions, appropriate attire, travel planning, and relaxation techniques.

DRESS FOR SUCCESS

Learn to match your appearance with job roles, emphasizing grooming and professional attire even on a tight budget. Centre-based and fun excursions to help build confidence and reinforce skills learned.



What is SLES?



SLES is a National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) funded support. It's designed to assist young adults find meaningful employment once they leave school by building their skills, independence, and confidence. SLES goes deeper than simply finding a job. It's about laying the foundations a young adult will need to engage with employers now and into their future - and building their capacity to live an independent life. SLES is aimed at 16 to 22 year olds. The goal of SLES is that a young adults gains meaningful employment that is paid at or above award rates. Examples of employment outcomes include:

- **Mainstream employment** – a job in the open market.
- **Customised employment** – working with local employers to create a meaningful job based on an individual's skills.
- **Micro-enterprise** – working with a participant to start up their own business providing a valuable service to their community.

Providers work with participants to help them get ready for work. They plan employment pathways and develop tailored activities to meet each participant's needs. Supports can be delivered individually, in a group, or a combination of both for up to two years. Participants can choose what programs they wish to do across any number of providers, it is about "Choice and Control".

At Your Enabled Services our unique programs are aligned to participants goals and delivery and are NOT confined to the traditional centre-based settings, they have been structured on our KIN club philosophy of Social, Emotional, Learning - real life, interactive and fun experiences to help foster growth and reinforce skills learned.
